**BOWLING CLUBS ROBBED.**

**Safe Blown Open.**

After forcing the front door of the Brighton Bowling Club's pavilion, thieves on Friday night blew open the door of a small safe in the office and stole £6 in notes and silver. The rooms were ransacked and cigars and cigarettes were stolen. The force of the explosion, which, it is believed, was caused by gelignite, shattered the door of the safe. Detective Brennan and Constable Fletcher are making inquiries.

Cigarettes and sweets valued at £5 were stolen from the premises of the Melbourne Bowling Club in Union street, Prahran, on Friday evening. The thieves gained entrance by forcing a door.
